Program Overview: Awards in the Fulbright Distinguished Chairs Program are viewed as among the most prestigious appointments in the Fulbright Scholar Program. Candidates should have a prominent record of scholarly accomplishment. Applicants should submit the one page Distinguished Chairs application form, a letter of interest (about three pages), a curriculum vitae (maximum eight pages) and a sample syllabus (maximum four pages) by the May 1 deadline. Following a review during the summer, scholars selected for the short list for each chair will be asked to complete a full application by August 1.

FULBRIGHT-AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL UNIVERSITY DISTINGUISHED CHAIR IN AMERICAN POLITICAL SCIENCE (AUSTRALIA)

Award #7001

Category: Distinguished Lecturing/Research

Grant Activity: Conduct collaborative research at the host institution and guest lectures or seminars at advanced undergraduate and postgraduate level. A national tour with guest presentations at 3-4 institutions across Australia. Other activities as negotiated with the host university.

DANISH DISTINGUISHED CHAIR IN HUMAN RIGHTS AND INTERNATIONAL STUDIES (DENMARK)

Award #7013

Category: Research

Grant Activity: This is a research position. The scholar is expected to contribute to the Institute's active academic exchange in weekly seminars with other researchers at the Institute and to facilitate the Institute's research networking with U.S. universities and research environments. In addition, the scholar will participate in conferences and teaching activities taking place within the Research Department and the Institute as a whole. Depending on the scholar's previous experience and academic qualifications, he/she will be asked to give some lectures as part of the courses given by the Danish Institute of Human Rights. This will amount to a maximum of 20% of the scholar's time. Guest lectures at Danish universities in Copenhagen, Odense, and Aarhus many also be arranged.

Specialization(s): The subjects broadly covered by the Research Department of the Danish Institute for Human Rights are as follows: (1) human rights standards and their implementation, (2) human rights and globalization and (3) human rights and vulnerable groups. Within each of the above-mentioned areas, the members of the Research Department work on the topics listed below. Preferably, the research of the scholar should cover one or more of these topics: (1) citizenship, human rights and religion, indivisible rights and international courts; (2) human rights and terrorism, rights-based approaches to development and conditionality and rights; and (3) human rights in prisons, the rights of the child and women's rights. The Danish Institute for Human Rights is a national human rights institution which is a part of the Danish Centre for International Studies and Human Rights. It promotes human rights through research, information, education and training activities, and via capacity building through projects in Eastern Europe and third world countries. The U.S. scholar will not only work within the Institute's multi-disciplinary research department but also contribute more generally to the work of the Institute through guest lecturing and possibly as an adviser on the implementation of some international projects where relevant.

Additional Qualifications: Professor with strong academic background in research and publications in political science, humanities, or law.

DANISH DISTINGUISHED CHAIR IN AMERICAN STUDIES (DENMARK)

Award #7014

Category: Lecturing/Research

Grant Activity: Teach two courses per semester at the B.A. and M.A. level. At the undergraduate level, courses taught are within the fields of American history, introduction to cultural theories, race and ethnicity, popular culture, U.S. markets and business development and American politics. At the graduate level, courses change every year, but fall within the same broad categories: history, politics, cultural identities and markets. The teaching load is 6 hours per week each term. The format is a mix of seminars, lectures, discussions, presentations, and oral reports. The average course size varies according to level: graduate courses are usually approximately 15 students, and undergraduate level classes have a maximum of 35 students. Students purchase their own books, which may be supplemented by photocopied readings. Provide thesis advising for graduate students. The Center would like to involve the Fulbright Scholar in the education of its Ph.D. students of which there are currently three (e.g. as co-counselors on their current projects). There are also possible research opportunities. The Center is currently planning two interdisciplinary research projects that should result in two conferences and two anthologies. One project will involve cooperation with scholars from the Miller Center of Public Affairs, University of Virginia, and the other with scholars from the University of Southern California. The chairholder will participate in a number of conferences and seminars on various themes within American studies organized by the Center. The chairholder will have easy access to a wide range of electronic journals, the university library and the Royal Library. Therefore, it will be possible to continue working on major projects, especially if the recipient is in the writing stage.

Specialization(s): American political culture and/or U.S. diplomatic history. Scholars with a U.S.-Latin American relations focus would be particularly welcome.

Additional Qualifications: Ph.D. required, plus a minimum of 3 years of teaching experience. Associate or full professors are preferred; however, professionals will also be taken into consideration provided that they have an appropriate educational background.

Grant Activity: Teach one survey course and a seminar in area of expertise. Supervise graduate theses and assist in curriculum development. Give occasional guest lectures at other universities. Teaching will require approximately five hours per week. Participate in the development of the North American Studies Program at the host university and in the meetings of the North American Studies Program board.
